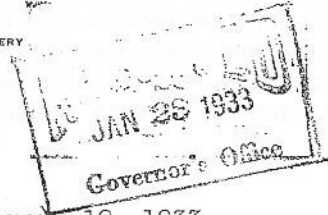

Honorable Sir:

Re: Mountain Meadow Massacre.

We have a man in our town, William T. Baker, son of George and Minerva Baker, victims of the Mountain Meadow Massacre of 1857.

William T. Baker was born in Carroll County, Arkansas, November 15th, 1856, making him seven or eight months of age at the time of this massacre.

Mr. Baker's father, mother, sisters, grandfather and several uncles and aunts were killed at that time, leaving himself and two sisters, whom, to his knowledge are the only living survivors of the massacre.

Mr. Baker, now of the age of 76 years, is an indigent person very much in need of financial assistance, and am writing you at his request to learn if the State of Utah has at any time made any effort or passed any law whereby any of the survivors of this tragedy could receive a compensation.
