MOUNTAIN MEADOW MASSACRE.

The Survivors to Hold a Reunion in
Arkansas.

HARRISON, Ark., Oct. 9.—The Boone County (Ark.) Fair opened here to-day. Gov. William Fishback entertained an audience of 5,000 people this afternoon with the first speech of the campaign. The Governor is a candidate for United States Senator, and advocated a change in the Constitution, making Senators elective by direct vote of the people.

A reunion of survivors of the Mountain Meadow Massacre is to take place here this week. James Lynch of Washington, represents the survivors in a suit against the United States, and he reached Harrison a day or two ago. The massacre occurred in September, 1857, and only fifteen children escaped death, ten of whom are now living, five of them in Boone County.

Capt. Lynch says the Mormon Church has been sued for \$256,000, and that the case is likely soon to be settled in favor of the plaintiffs. The wagon train had \$70,000 in money, and \$26,000 in cattle, besides household effects.

Capt. Lynch was in the United States Army and assisted at the rescue. He has since devoted almost his entire attention to the survivors.
